Wednesday, 11 October 2023, 12:00pm MDT Prescribed Burns as a Tool to Mitigate Future Wildfire Smoke Exposure

Can prescribed fire reduce future smoke impacts? Dr. Makoto Kelp with Standford University will discuss how targeted prescribed burn treatments in heavily forested Western states may have an outsized impact on improving air quality for the western U.S. by reducing the likelihood of future wildfire smoke.

Tuesday, 14 November 2023, 12:00pm MDT Indigenous Fire Management and Southwestern Fire-Climate Relationships

Did traditional Indigenous fire management act as a buffer on the relationship between climate and wildfires? Dr. Tom Swetnam with the University of Arizona will present on how restoring or emulating Indigenous fire practices could buffer climate impacts at local scales, but would need to be broadly and repeatedly implemented for regional benefits.

Supporting Prescribed Fire in New Mexico

How is prescribed fire legislated, planned, and carried out in New Mexico? Brian Filip, EMNRD Forestry Division, and Sam Berry, Forest Stewards Guild, will talk about New Mexico's new prescribed burner certification program, including the law and certification process, and how prescribed burns are often implemented cooperatively, as through the All Hands All Lands program.
