Audience

The NM Wildland Urban Summit is attended by community members, fire service volunteers and professionals, non-profit conservation groups engaged in fire adaptation, and federal, state and local government representatives.

Submission Requirements (due July 31, 2020 to awebb@nmcounites.org)

- 1. Maximum 20 word title (including subtitle) of presentation
- 2. Maximum 100 word description of presentation
- 3. More in-depth description of what the attendee can learn
- 4. Speaker biography (short)
- 5. Audio/visual needs
- 6. Other needs

Types of Presentations

- 1) Lightning Talk (5-minutes)
- 2) Peer Learning Session (30 minutes)
- 3) Group/General Presentation (45 minutes 1 hour)

Lightning Talk (5-minutes)

The planning team is interested in lightning presentations that tell stories, share challenges, and show how practitioners are rising to the challenge. Lightning talks will be part of a topical group panel of 3-5 people totaling 15-25 minute combined talks and will include breakout sessions.

Peer Learning Session (30-minutes)

The planning team is interested in providing peer learning sessions that meet the needs of practitioners and consider these best practices (https://fireadaptednetwork.org/best-practices-for-designing-peer-learning-exchanges/).

Group/General Presentation (45 minutes - 1 hour)

The planning team is interested in providing group/general presentations that provide broader topics such as research findings and large scale issues.
